**Duration:** 10 weeks, including 1-week Vocational Pathways and 1-week work experience

**Hours:** **Week 1** (Vocational Pathways) is 9am – 4pm Monday to Friday

**Weeks 2–10** (Hospitality) is a combination of morning and afternoon shifts and may include some weekend work.

Hours: Shift work (up to 6 hours) between 7am and 5pm

## What is Vocational Pathways?

### Week 1

A **vocation** is a paid job. **Vocational Pathways** is a training program that provides the stepping stones and pathway to getting a job.

The Vocational Skills course is designed to equip you with the skills you need to get a job and keep it. ## Let's talk about the training

### Weeks 2-9

The Certificate II in Hospitality will take place between Bright's training facility and the GIANTS Café.

Students learn the skills and practices required to start working in the hospitality industry including:

- Preparation for working in a commercial kitchen
- Work place safety, food handling
- Working effectively with others
- Coffee making
- Responsible Service of Alcohol (RSA)
- Commercial cleaning skills
- Meal service
- Front of house, customer service
- Catering, food preparation

### Week 10

Students complete work experience with our café, restaurant or hotel partners. You gain hands-on experience in another commercial environment, to ensure you are equipped to hit the ground running in your new job.

The location for work experience will be advised during the course.

## Let's talk about the jobs

### After graduation

Bright works tirelessly to find great job opportunities for our graduates. Our Employment Partners are looking for reliable, hard-working and honest employees who take pride in their work and operate well as part of a team.

Some of the jobs you will be qualified for are Kitchen Hand, Apprentice Chef, Coffee Maker, Food preparation, Waitperson, Commercial Cleaner

Jobs in a commercial kitchen are fast-paced, labor-intensive and work is often outside normal working hours.

Candidates must be fit and healthy and able to stand for long periods of time.



### What duties are required in a kitchen?

Some duties could include, but are not limited to:

- Food preparation
- Chopping vegetables
- Preparing meat & fish
- cooking
- stocking pantry
- Dishwashing
- Baking
- Sweeping, mopping floors
- Cleaning
- Serving customers

### What are the hours and location of work?

The specific requirements of each job depend on the employer and may include mornings, evenings and weekend shifts.

Bright works tirelessly to have plenty of employment opportunities to suit all our graduates. We also equip you with the tools and confidence to search for a job yourself.



### What is the pay rate?

This is different for each employer and the shifts you work. We only work with ethical employers who offer fair pay and support for their employees.

### Individual support and mentoring

At the end of week 1, each student receives an individual learning plan, tailored to their needs and ambitions. We provide case support and mentoring for the duration of the program and for twelve months after graduation.

### How do you get there?

If you are driving, there is limited parking available at the classroom itself, with additional parking nearby.

The classroom is 550m from Olympic Park Station – less than 10 minutes walk.
